

**THE MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING

The Board of Kingman County Commissioners met in special session at the Norwich school, Norwich, Kansas, on October 9, 2013. Those present:

Commissioner Foley declared that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The purpose of the meeting was to share information with the public about the proposed Kingman County Law Enforcement Center project. Approximately 20 visitors attended the meeting.

Commissioner Foley welcomed those in attendance and thanked them for coming. He then introduced Kingman County Sheriff Randy Hill, who spoke about the conditions in the current LEC, the history of the current building, and the need for a new LEC. He also shared architect's drawings of the new building and explained the design.

Commissioner Foley noted that an LEC Review Committee that studied the need for a new facility included members of the public that represented all parts of the county.

Commissioner Carol Voran spoke about how the new LEC would be funded and where it would be built.

Foley, Voran and Hill answered questions from the public about the project.
