Sheriff investigating animal abuse incident in Cunningham

The Kingman County Sheriff's Office is investigating the shooting of a dog in Cunningham.

Deputies responded to Cunningham on the evening of May 6 to a report of a dog being shot. On arrival, they found a small, mixed-breed dog (possibly a dachshund mix) with injuries to its nose and jaw from a small caliber firearm. The dog was taken to a veterinary clinic in Kingman, where it was treated for the injuries.

No owner of the dog has been located and deputies continue to follow leads in the case. As of May 14, Swaney Veterinary Clinic, which is caring for the dog, reports the animal will recover from the injuries.

Anyone with information about the dog's injuries or owner should contact the Kingman County Sheriff's Office at 620-532-5133.

The case will be turned over to the Kingman County Attorney once the investigation is complete.
