Annual severe weather program at theater Feb. 27

This year's severe weather/storm spotter program returns to the Historic Kingman Theater at 6:30 p.m. Feb. 27. The theater is located at 237 N. Main.

The program, also known as "Storm Fury on the Plains," is presented early each spring by the National Weather Service. The program includes fun and exciting pictures and videos, severe weather safety tips and an opportunity to hear and pose questions to a NWS meteorologist.

This free event is open to everyone – you do not have to commit to being a storm spotter and no pre-registration is required. The program typically lasts about 90 minutes. This will be the only severe weather/storm spotter presentation in the county this year.

Concessions will be available for purchase with proceeds going to support the theater.

"We are very excited to have the theater for our venue again this year," said Fred Simon, Kingman County Emergency Manager. "The theater gives us a more comfortable sitting arrangement and allows more people to come to the event. We had a great turnout last year and look forward to a good crowd again this year."

Severe Weather Awareness Week in Kansas will be March 5-11. The state's annual tornado safety drill will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday, March 7 – weather permitting.
