### **Canvass adds a few votes in Kingman County**

Seven provisional ballots were counted Monday during the official canvass of the Primary Election in Kingman County but none of the outcomes changed for local candidates.

Republican Fred Foley added one vote to his victory for the Kingman County Commission, District 1 nomination, the only contested county race on the ballot. He will face Libertarian candidate John Kostner in November. Two other candidates in the race – Republicans Greg Ellis and Mike Eidem – also each added one vote. Final totals in the race: Foley, 291; Eidem, 169; Mark Becker, 60; Ellis, 30.

County Clerk Carol Noblit picked up seven more votes, putting her final total at 1,147 votes. Noblit, a Republican, is unopposed in November.

Six provisional ballots were not counted because none of those voters were registered within the time frame required by law to vote in the primary.

Other local offices on the ballot were precinct committeemen and committeewomen and township treasurers. Precinct positions are elected at the primary. However, several precincts did not elect anyone because no one received the minimum requirement of five votes. In those cases, the positions will be filled by appointment.

Township treasurer candidates had to get a minimum of three votes to advance to the General Election ballot. That happened in 16 townships. There will be no candidates listed on the November ballot in the other seven townships because no candidate garnered the minimum vote total.

The voter turnout for the Primary Election was nearly 28 percent of the county's 5,541 registered voters.
