Kingman County canvass adds one ballot to primary

Monday's canvass of the March 3 City of Kingman primary election added one provisional ballot but did not change any outcomes.

The ballot was the only provisional one cast, according to County Clerk Carol Noblit. The Board of Kingman County Commissioners also serves as the canvassing board and the canvass was conducted just prior to the commission's regular weekly meeting. The ballot was cast by a registered voter.

The ballot added three votes in the Kingman City Commission race, the only race on the primary ballot. It changed the total votes for three candidates as follows: Charlus J. Bishop, to 335 votes; Nathan R. Smith, to 98 votes, and Thomas Trezise Jr., to 91 votes.

The primary narrowed the field of 10 candidates to six. Voters will elect three Kingman city commissioners on April 7.

Candidates advancing to the general election are Bishop, Merlin McFarland, Mark A. Arensdorf, Roland L. Belcher, Mark Schnittker and Elizabeth A. Madden. Bishop, Belcher and Madden are the incumbents.

Candidates eliminated in the primary were Smith, Trezise Jr., Dallas McClafin and Jamee Hillman.
