Voter registration deadline is Oct. 14

Time is running out to become a registered voter for the Nov. 4 General Election. The last day to register is Oct. 14.

All new voters, according to Kansas law, must present proof of U.S. citizenship when registering. Valid citizenship documents include a birth certificate, passport or U.S. military record of service showing place of birth in the United States. For a complete list of acceptable documents, visit the Kingman County website, kingmancoks.com, and go to the Elections page.

Kingman County residents can register to vote at the County Clerk's office, located on the second floor of the courthouse in Kingman. New voters also can register at the city office in Kingman, the Kingman County Health Department and First National Bank in Cunningham. The registration application is posted on the county's website.

The county website also has the form to request an advance ballot. County Clerk Carol Noblit will begin mailing out advance ballots on Oct. 15. The last day to request an advance ballot to be mailed is Oct. 31 and all advance ballots must be returned by the close of polls on Election Day.

In-person advance voting begins Oct. 22 at the clerk's office and continues until noon on Monday, Nov. 3. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day. Remember to bring a valid photo ID with you – it is required to vote.
